Penguin Project plays provide young artists that are differently abled (including Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, autism, intellectual disabilities, learning disabilities, visual impairment, hearing impairment, delays, emotional disorders, and other neurological disorders) the opportunity to star in the roles of a musical. These artists are joined on stage by a "peer mentor" – a volunteer buddy that works alongside the artist through the full rehearsal and performance process.

- 🐧 Parts for all levels and abilities!
- 🐧 Ages 6 - 22
(Contact the GCT Executive Director or Penguin Project Program Director with questions regarding specific age exceptions, impairments, and wheelchair use)
- 🐧 Rehearsals for full cast are 75 minutes, 2 days a week.
- 🐧 Lead roles with larger responsibilities could meet up to 4 days a week. Each rehearsal includes a snack!
- 🐧 Rehearsal calendar is determined based on conflicts provided by participants.

Mentors will attend a separate "Bootcamp" training session, and be paired with an artist through a special selective process. Mentors will rehearse when their artist/partner rehearses.
